initiative funded by the European Commission, dedicated to boosting the international mobility of students and professionals between Africa and Europe. With a focus on enhancing youth employability and elevating the quality of Vocational Training, SAAM is set to revolutionize cross-continental collaboration.

Uniting 19 European partners from 8 countries and 16 African partners representing 17 nations, SAAM is a dynamic force. From professional training centers to non-formal training organizations, congregations, and educational networks, it engages a diverse array of entities, including NGOs working in youth training and umbrella European organizations. SAAM's impact extends across the entire spectrum of education and youth employment.

Officially launched in January 2020, SAAM unfolds in three phases, each with unique mobility flows: European VET Teacher Exploration: Over 100 European VET teachers embark on a twoweek journey to African VET centers, studying and observing educational systems. Engaging in job-shadowing, they compile comprehensive reports on their experiences. Returning to Europe armed with data, ideas, and firsthand knowledge, these teachers collaborate to bridge the gap between European and African VET systems, exchanging content, methodologies,

technologies, and management strategies. African Teacher Empowerment: More than 100 African teachers travel to Europe for a month

of training and job shadowing. Armed with new tools and methods, they return to implement

positive changes in their centers, contributing to the overall advancement of Vocational Training in Africa. Student Mobility Experience: The final flow sees over 300 students transported to various European countries. Stationed in 30 hosting centers, they undergo varying lengths of stays, combining periods at VET centers with professional traineeships in European companies. These experiences not only enhance students' personal and professional capacities but also contribute to their empowerment upon returning home.

AKMI's Remarkable Contribution

AKMI is the only Greek partner of the consortium, providing its network and expertise in the

VET sector. The primary aim of this gathering was to foster acquaintance, elucidate the project's phases and implementation methodology, and to introduce the hosting partner, Don Bosco Boys Town. The occasion also provided an opportunity to engage with their
