Co-organized by the European Association of Institutes for Vocational Training (EVBB), the European Vocational Training Association (EVTA), and EfVET, the event was held in the vibrant city of Turin, Italy.

Our **Director, Theodor Grassos**, proudly represented **AKMI International** in this inspiring gathering of experts, educators, and policymakers. The event addressed the most pressing challenges in adult learning, fostering engaging discussions and presenting innovative ideas.

02 | MoMaVET Mobility Flow in Athens





Earlier in December, during the week of 9 to 13 December, **AKMI** welcomed **10 students** and **2 trainers** from Albania, from the School of Hospitality and Tourism in Tirana and the Vocational School "Hysen Çela" in Durrës, in Athens.

This mobility flow was organized as part of the **MoMaVET** project and AKMI is the **lead partner** for the mobilities (evaluation, organization, implementation) in this project, starting with this first flow. In total, the mobilities will be organized in 5 phases from December to summer 2025 in Athens, involving **50 students** and **10 teachers** from Albania.

In this mobility phase, we hosted students from two different fields: **Hospitality and Hotel Management and Culinary Studies**. The program was quite extensive and the participants had the opportunity to visit, learn and practice many things relevant to their field of study.



Key Highlights

Students had the opportunity to observe and learn about the work processes at the local pizzeria *Galeone* and participate in a short workshop on pizza techniques. They also

visited *Varvakeios Market*, a local food market, to learn about the role of this local market and have conversations with butchers, fishmongers and food vendors. They also visited *Airvissa Travel* and learned a lot about how a travel agency works and discussed the challenges and trends in the travel and tourism industry with the staff. The students also visited the *Shedia Home*, where the co-founder presented this social project that helps disadvantaged people, especially the homeless people.

AKMI and especially the **Hospitality and Culinary Campus** hosted the students in their premises where they had a great experience with a **cooking workshop** led by **Executive Chef, Stavros Zeakis**, a tour of the facilities of the Tourism Department and a short cocktail masterclass. They also visited the **Melia Hotel**, a 4-star hotel in the city center, and observed the kitchen and operations of the hotel, being divided into two groups according to their profile.



They also had two different cultural activities. The first was a visit to the *Pyrgos Vassilisis* winery, where they had the opportunity to take part in a guided tour of the facilities, learn about the history and process of winemaking and taste six different wines, three white and three red. The second cultural activity was a guided tour of the Acropolis and its surroundings.

Overall, **MoMaVET** is an Erasmus+ capacity building project in Vocational Education and Training that aims to strengthen the capacity of both the Albanian authorities responsible

for the VET system and the national vocational schools in order to improve the country's strategy for utilising Erasmus+ mobility opportunities.
