The Winter Camp on Vocational Excellence, titled "...and this is how VET saved the (human) world – Learners' journey in a CoVE", took place in Nova Gorica, Slovenia. Representing the Centre of Vocational Excellence (CoVE) project TourX on sustainable tourism education (Project Number 101056184), Marievi Gretsi, Team Leader at AKMI SA, participated in the camp, contributing to this unique exchange of ideas and practices.

During the Winter Camp on Vocational Excellence, AKMI reaffirmed its commitment to becoming a benchmark in Vocational Education and Training (VET). By actively engaging in European initiatives and promoting excellence in skills development, AKMI is on a clear path to becoming a VET Excellence School. Through strong partnerships, innovation in teaching methods, and a learner-centered approach, AKMI is shaping a future where vocational education is not just an alternative, but a top choice for young people seeking meaningful and future-proof careers.

This inspiring initiative was part of the EU-funded project Internationalising Vocational Excellence, implemented by the European Training Foundation (ETF). The camp featured an engaging and interactive programme designed by three experienced CoVEs—Talentjourney, GreenoVET, and PoVE Water—who shared their expertise, tools, and insights. The event was organised in close cooperation with EfVET, EVBB, and EVTA, bringing together a diverse community of professionals and educators from across Europe.

During the camp, participants explored new ways of teaching and learning, focusing on agile skills, personalisation and innovation in vocational education. Emphasis was also placed on building strong cross-sector partnerships, improving mental health and inclusion within learning environments, and developing long-term strategies for governance, funding, and policy support. The future of VET was at the heart of discussions, particularly in relation to digital transformation, sustainability, and the importance of green skills in preparing a resilient workforce.

The Winter Camp served as a powerful reminder that excellence in vocational education is not a destination but an ongoing process. Through collaboration, creativity, and inclusion, VET can empower individuals, strengthen communities, and contribute meaningfully to addressing global challenges. 02 I ALLIANCE kick off meeting in AKMI International





In mid-March, AKMI hosted 20 VET learners and 4 trainers from Tourism and Hospitality Departments of 4 different VET schools of Albania (Tirana, Korçe, Vlorë and Elbasan). As the Lead Partner of the mobilities, AKMI welcomed the group in Athens within the EU-funded project, MoMaVET.

The participants had the opportunity to visit a cafeteria and learnt about the preparation of different types of coffee, a local pizzeria, a local food market, a travel agency, a 4-star hotel and a local winery. They also learned about an interesting project that helps people with disabilities to integrate into the labour market and took a tour of the Acropolis.





On Wednesday, 19th of March, the Hospitality and Culinary Campus of AKMI VET school hosted the students in their premises where they had a great experience with a cookery workshop, a tour of the tourism department facilities and a short wine tasting and masterclass.
